RECIPE: CHRISTMAS COOKIES BY: BEN K AND FOX B

Ingredients:
1 cup butter
2/3 cup sugar
1 egg
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
1/8 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 1/3 cups all purpose flour



DIRECTIONS:

BEAT BUTTER AND SUGAR TOGETHER IN A STANDARD MIXER UNTIL LIGHT AND FLUFFY.

ADD EGG, BAKING POWDER, SALT, AND VANILLA. MIZ TOGETHER UNTIL SMOOTH

Divide dough in half, shape each into flat disc, and refrigerate for 30 min. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350 F, lining two baking sheets with parchment paper or silicone liners.

FLOUR SPACE, THEN ROLL DOUGH TO ABOUT 1/4 INCH THICK. CUT OUT COOKIES WITH COOKIE CUTTERS BAKE UNTIL COOKIES ARE SLIGHTLY DARKENED AT EDGES, 6-9 MINS LET COOL, THEN DECORATE!

The Science of the Jet Engine

Did you know that the size of the Boeing 777 engine is the size of the fuselage, or body, of the Boeing 737? The engine of an aircraft is one of the most vital parts to flight. It creates one of the four forces of flight, thrust, and combats drag. There is a specific process in which the air molecules go through to deliver the necessary thrust.

1. Intake

a. The air molecules, or more simply air, is pulled into the front of the engine.

2. Compression

a. The air is then compressed. Many aviators group intake and compression together. To create both intake and compression, the engine utilities a fan.

3. Combustion

a. In this stage, air is mixed with fuel to cause a spark.

4. Expansion

a. Due to the spark, the gases expand.

5. Exhaust

a. The expanded air leaves through the back of the engine. Using Newton's third law of motion, the force moving backward has an equal effect so that the engine has an equal speed going forward.
